For over 20 years, the Mountains Recreation & Conservation Authority’s Outdoor Education program has been providing deeply meaningful outdoor experiences to students who have limited access and familiarity with nature. Tied to California State Standards and the Education and the Environment Initiative (EEI), our lessons focus on the unique Mediterranean ecosystem, dynamic local history and threatened watersheds.

Our programs serve predominantly 4th - 6th grade for a three to five day Outdoor Education experience in the heart of the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area. We offer programs at King Gillette Ranch in Calabasas and Temescal Gateway Park in Pacific Palisades.
